Pilgrims' path to Pilgrim Circle

- · Pilgrims' Circle with three stylised 'candles'
- Seating for reflection
- Central 'candle' with Pilgrims' Prayer
- Left 'candle' has MMK quote:
 "There, where you are, you will find God" 1867
- Right 'candle' has MMK quote:
 "Oh, how I wish we would only remember we
 are but travellers here."
 Written in Penola, to Mary's mother, Flora—
 November 1866

- Seating for visitors
- Hopscotch game on green area
- Two identical wall plaques at either end of the white Mt Gambier stone fences

- Landscaping
- Two picnic tables provided by Wattle Range Council

STAGE 2: BLESSED & OPENED—JUNE 29, 2014

- 3 'Prayer Stations' added to Pilgrims' Path with reflective quotes from MMK
- Wording on the three Prayer Stations:
 - "Try at least to excuse what you cannot understand" MMK 1877
 - "If we have love I our hearts, we shall have God with us" - ммк 1890
 - "Find Happiness in making others happy" -MMK 1899
- Shade sails added to cover picnic tables

 Cluster of silhouetted figures mounted on slate paving added to centre of Park

 Mary looking towards Julian; child beckons to others to join them

- Bell-boy figure added to the rear of the main Park sign.
- He has a button to press—visitors can hear a recorded version of the story of the Park, written and narrated by Josephite Historian, Sr Marie Foale.
