During the April holidays this year we have two boys attending Youthtown Panmure each day from 8.30am to 4pm and two boys participating in a two day programme provided by the St Heliers Church-Community Centre. Also tickets for visits to the usual attractions are being supplied.

Again the two additions to our programme are only possible with the help of Halamehi Anea, our invaluable volunteer, who picks up all the loose ends and ensures that the children arrive and depart from their 'pick-up, drop off' places at the appointed times. At the present moment we are closing the House for a fortnight to allow maintenance painting of ceilings, window frames and sills upstairs to be carried out. This will be the final major maintenance outlay for the present financial year which ends 30 June 2009. All grants applied for, for this financial year have been received.

Again we thank all our wonderful friends and supporters. Without your prayers and monetary donations we would be unable to offer this service of hospitality.
