
<u>OF THE HOLY CROSS</u>

Silent prayer

Reflection:

The triumph of the Cross probably sounded to first century ears the way the triumph of the electric chair would to our own.

Today's feast is a celebration of the kind of divine foolishness Paul talks about in first Corinthians a stumbling block to some, yet the source of salvation.

In Jesus' crucifixion, our God of reversal has transformed a symbol of brutal tyranny and oppression into a sign of Divine Power. Even at its most horrible, human evil is overturned to divine righteousness; the one executed unjustly is transformed into the radiant sun of justice and glory.

"The Chapter calls us to be open to God's action in and through our weakness generous in our fidelity to the Cross, open to love and freed for mission."
