- a lighted candle to remind us that we share in the journey of the cross with Jesus who is the light and hope of the world
- a Bible to remind us to take the time to reflect on the Word of God during Lent and to listen to what God is saying to us through the Word
- a cross to remind us that Jesus loved us enough to lay down his life for us
- our Caritas appeal envelopes to remind us that Lent is a time to share what we have with those in need
- seasonal changes the autumn leaves that remind us of the cycle of life; that all things must die so that they can rise to new life

We think about the need to change and how we can work towards this and we ask God to help us recognize what we need to change in our lives so that we may live more closely with Him. And we ask God to give us the strength we need to change so that we can follow Him more closely every day.

In the Church of St Francis by the Sea at Manly, Whangaparaoa is a



beautiful icon written by the studio of St John the Baptist in Auckland. It was commissioned by a parishioner at St Francis and is modeled on the San Damiano Crucifix painted in Umbria Italy in the 12th Century.

It is an extremely beautiful icon and at the foot of the cross are some figures, which I have enlarged so they can be seen a little more clearly. The figures in the original were thought to have been Umbrian saints but adapting this to our time the writer has included St Therese of Liseux, St Clare of Assisi, St Francis of Assisi, St Peter Chanel and St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

Every Sunday when I go to Mass I have the pleasure of seeing this and thinking again about Mary's wonderful devotion to the Cross.
