Sr Moya Campbell rsj has appointed been by Sisters of St Joseph to 'walk' with the Josephite Associates over the next three years. She is working especially with **IJALT** (International Josephite Associate Leadership Team)

to support us to develop our Associates to become a sustainable and autonomous organisation.

As part of this role Sr Moya is presently visiting Associates across Australia and New Zealand as a means of gaining a 'big picture' view of happening in our regions/states. In early May she visited South Australia. Here Sr Mova met with the Josephite Leadership Team, namely Srs Margaret Cleary, Brigette Sipa and Chris Schwerdt. She had a gathering with many of the Sisters to gain their perspectives on the Associates and to share with them about her role and our future.

On the afternoon of the 2nd May about 12 Associates met with Sr Moya. This was a time for her to listen to our story of what is happening here in South Australia. We shared the activities that occur in Adelaide and acknowledged the presence of our many Associates in country areas, many who are very involved in their communities, and those who are no longer able to be present at gatherings due to illness or age. Sr Moya listened as Associates shared their thoughts of the value of being Associates and possibilities for the future of our movement. Sr Moya also outlined the different pathways which people are choosing to be connected in with the Josephite story: as Sisters or Associates, or as Covenant Josephites or Privately Vowed. Following this gathering, Sr Moya met with our Leadership Team over an evening meal at the Kingswood Convent. This was a valuable time for us to share our hopes for the future.

We look forward to Sr Moya's sharing with us later in the year about what emerges from her visits to the different regions.

Our Associate Focus in 2018/2019

A reminder that our current focus centres around the issue of social justice. As such we are directing our efforts towards Catherine House and the Mercy House of Welcome at Kilburn. Queensland Josephite Associate Conference by Mary Hemmings

In May this year I was privileged to be invited to speak at the Queensland Associate Conference in Brisbane. About 45 Associates and Sisters gathered, with people coming from as far away as Rockhampton and Townsville, together with staff from some schools.

The theme of the Conference was **Step Forward with Mary MacKillop** – **Find our Path in the World Today**. Sr Monica Cavanagh, the Josephite Congregational Leader, delivered an inspiring opening address on the Friday evening, reflecting on some of the qualities that Mary MacKillop showed as she stepped forward in her time. She spoke of Mary MacKillop as:

- a woman of presence and passion,
- a woman of courage and compassion,
- a woman of hospitality and humility.

Sr Monica helped us to see that Mary's story invites us to be, like Mary, courageous risk-takers moving beyond the familiar to embrace new hopes and new dreams. Just as Mary stepped forward with dignity, we too can do the same, taking the honourable action no matter what others think.

I was asked to speak on **Josephite Associates: Our Mission into the Future**. For this I used Pope Francis's Prayer Intention for the month of May as my focus: "That the **lay faithful** may fulfil their **specific mission** by responding with **creativity** to the **challenges** that face the world **today**."

In light of this, I reflected that we are all on about God's Mission. "By virtue of our baptism, all the

members of the People of God have become missionary disciples. <u>All the baptized</u>, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization." (Vatican 11)

Joan Chittester, a Benedictine Sister says: "A charism is a continuing force which compels us to participate in the mission of Jesus by addressing contemporary issues." As Josephite Associates who share in the charism of Mary MacKillop, we therefore are invited to support one another in being aware of how we can make a difference in our sphere of influence so that in our everyday lives we can "respond with creativity to the challenges that face the world today."

Pam Betts, Executive Director of Brisbane Catholic Education, presented on our last day. She looked at Mary's story and ours today through the lens of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. In her words: "We live in a world which demands much from us but so did Mary of the Cross MacKillop. ...the attributes she possessed are needed now and into the future."

The Conference was a time of great energy and enthusiasm and those present were certainly committed to continuing to 'grow' our Associate movement as a way of continuing God's mission. I delighted in being part of an enthusiastic and committed group of people so willing to follow in the footsteps of Mary MacKillop.
