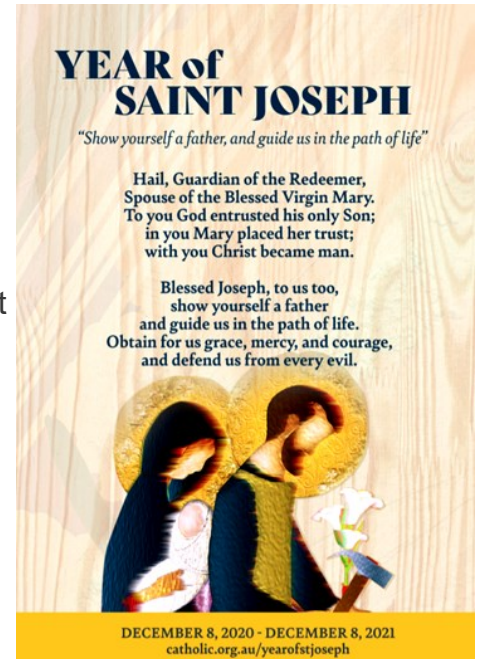

A meditation on Pope Francis'

<p>Loving Father,</p>	<p>St Joseph has always been venerated as a father by Christian people. He concretely expressed his fatherhood by making an offering to God of himself in love. In him, Jesus saw the tender love of God, guiding, teaching and caring in his daily life.</p>
<p>Obedient Father,</p>	<p>Joseph, in obedience to God, protected Mary and Jesus as he taught his Son to "do the will of the Father." Called by God to serve the mission of Jesus, he "cooperated... in the great mystery of Redemption."</p>
<p>Accepting Father,</p>	<p>Joseph accepted Mary unconditionally — an important gesture even today. But the bridegroom of Mary is also the one who, trusting in the Lord, accepted his life, even the events that he did not understand.</p>
<p>A father who is creatively courageous,</p>	<p>Joseph's spiritual path "is not one that explains, but accepts" — which does not mean that he is "resigned." Instead, he is courageously and firmly proactive. Full of hope, he is able to accept life as it is, with all its contradictions, frustrations and disappointments." Through St Joseph, it is as if God were repeating to us "Do not be afraid!" because faith gives meaning to every event, however happy or sad. Joseph did not look for shortcuts but confronted reality with open eyes and accepted personal responsibility for it. For this reason, he encourages us to accept and welcome others as they are, without exception, and to show special concern for the weak.</p>

proclamation of the Year of St Joseph

<p>A working Father</p>	<p>A carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family, St Joseph also taught us the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labour. There needs to be a renewed appreciation of the importance of dignified work, of which Saint Joseph is an exemplary patron. Those who work, are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around us. We are called to rediscover the value, the importance and the necessity of work for bringing about a new 'normal' from which no one is excluded. In the light of rising unemployment due to the Covid-19 pandemic, everyone is invited to review priorities and to express the firm conviction that no young person, no person at all, no family should be without work!</p>
<p>A Father in the shadows.</p>	<p>Joseph knew how to love with extraordinary freedom. He never made himself the centre of things. He did not think of himself but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus. Happiness for Joseph involved a true gift of self: His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust. Joseph stands out, therefore, as an exemplary figure for our time in a world that needs fathers. True fathers refuse to live the lives of their children for them, and instead respect their freedom. In this sense, a father realises that he is most a father and an educator at the point when he becomes 'useless,' when he sees that his child has become independent and can walk the paths of life unaccompanied.</p>
