 After Archer 's dismissal as Secretary for Lands by the Berry Ministry in 1878 (Note 1 29/1/78) one of his attempts to secure permanent employment was as Managing Director of the Intercolonial Life Assurance Annuity and General Association (Limited), 247 George Street, Sydney. This venture was not successful. Archer seems to have been in Sydney in 1879-80 but in 1881 he is back in Melbourne applying (unsuccessfully) for the librarianship of the Public Library.
